**Subject:** Language Arts

**Expectation(s):** Can identify the root, prefix, and suffix of a given word

**Materials needed:** Attached worksheet

**Teaching and learning tips/strategies:**

- Practice adding these two prefixes (un & re) to other words to illustrate how each prefix always changes the meaning of the word in the same way (i.e. adding “re” always means “again” or “back to”; adding “un” always means “not” or “the opposite of”).
- Read a story and have your student try to find all the words with prefixes.
- Don’t forget to praise your student’s efforts!
