Subject: Math

Expectation(s): Can add and subtract with money (up to \$1.00)

Materials needed: Game board (attached), assorted coins (6 each of pennies, nickels, dimes, & quarters), 2 six-sided dice (use small pieces of masking tape to cover one and label its sides with the letters A-F)

Lesson Description: Clean up the Money

Tell your student you're going to be playing a game called "Clean up the Money."

The game is played as follows: each player gets 3 of each coin. Players take turn placing one coin at a time on an empty spot on the game board until all 24 coins have been placed. The first player rolls the dice to form an ordered pair (e.g. B4, for example) and takes the coin on that space (if there is no coin on the space, they get nothing). The second player does the same. Play continues until one player has a total of \$1.00.

Teaching and learning tips/strategies:

- This game is designed to give your student practice with sorting and counting coins. If your student is struggling to count the coins, use the attached hundreds chart to show visually what the coins are worth (e.g. to represent the value of three dimes, you would put one dime on the 10 space, the second dime on the 20 space and the third dime on the 30 space; make sure to explain that with this method of counting coins, the last coin shows the overall value).
- Have fun and don't forget to praise your student's effort!
